How to be prepared

Although we may not be able to prevent earthquakes, we can reduce the level of damage by being appropriately prepared. Think about what you can do.

- Know evacuation sites. (Around the university and your home) Talk with your family about how you will contact or meet each other
- Research and register for disaster message board services. (You need to register your email address in advance)

Know the route to get home and how long it will take. (People walk about 2.5 km/h on foot during disasters.) Prepare and record disaster memos.

- Know specific methods for collecting information and emergency evacuation sites. (Around school and along
- commuting routes) Consider methods for preventing things from falling down, and prepare emergency evacuation kits.
- Know and prepare lists of contacts, i.e. university. friends

1. Emergency Contact System

(* This system is for students and full-time teaching staff of this school.) The purpose of the Emergency Contact System is to confirm everyone's safety in the event of a major earthquake. The system will automatically send an email to the mobile phone address provided. The address used will be the one provided at admission or when registering for courses. If your address changes, be sure to inform an academic office (Academic Affairs Office < Ikebukuro>, Academic Affairs Office <Niiza>, Independent Graduate Schools Office, Rikkyo Second Stage College Office) of the change (staff should inform the Human Resources Department).

The Emergency Contact System will also be tested 1 or 2 times per year to confirm that it is working.

Also, using the Emergency Contact System, important announcement such as cancellation of lectures for the entire university in emergency situations may be informed.

2. Contact Methods

Should a major earthquake occur, use one of the following methods to inform the university of your safety.

If Mobile Phones Can Be Used

Reply to the email that the university has sent to your mobile phones (see figure to right).

If Mobile Phones Cannot Be Used

When On or Nearby Campus

Place the Safety Confirmation Card at the end of this handbook inside one of the Safety Confirmation Collection Boxes installed at the Ikebukuro Campus Security Room or Niiza Campus Security Gatehouse.

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- Campus buildings are built to resist major earthquakes, so remain calm even if an earthquake occurs.
- Until the earthquake settles down, wait inside the classroom and do not go outside.
- Open the classroom door to make sure you have an exit in case of emergency.
- Beware of objects falling from above, and stay underneath a desk or protect your head with a bag or clothing. When crawling under a desk, be sure to hold the desk legs firmly.
- Closing curtains and blinds can prevent glass shards from scattering (but only do so if safe).
- Be extremely careful if using volatile materials for experiments or the like.
- In the event of an emergency, announcements will be made using the school PA system.

Mental Preparation

Remain calm, and make sure you are safe.

Check for buildings tilting, cracks in the wall and the like.
Are there any fires? If a fire has occurred, then cooperate with those around you and extinguish it to the extent that is safe. If extinguishing the fire seems unfeasible, then retreat from the fire.

POINT -

Are there any injured people? If there are injured people, then cooperate with those around you to perform first aid and contact the administration office.

Basis for Deciding to Move to Evacuation Site

 If there is no danger of windows, blackboards, televisions or the like collapsing, nothing falling from the ceiling and no leaking chemicals then it is safer to remain where you are.

Points to Remember When Taking Action

- In case of fire, cover your mouth with a towel or the like to avoid breathing in smoke.
- Check which movement route would be the safest, and use stairs instead of elevators.

Evacuation Sites

Evacuation sites are classrooms inside campus buildings. Depending on circumstances, the university may givedirections regarding evacuation sites.

POINT -

Evacuation sites other than the campus buildings are described below.

Ikebukuro Campus

Evacuation Sites >> In front of Tucker Hall, in front of Dining Hall, in front of Main Building, in front of Building No.5

Niiza Campus

Evacuation Sites Athletic Field, in front of Building No.1

Go Home? Stay on Campus?

Once the aftershocks have slowed down and things settle down, you should consider going home. If transportation is down, you will have to walk home. A guideline for walking home is 10 km. People who live more than 10 km away should go to an evacuation site. Gather accurate information from television or radio.



- Be careful of your surroundings and prioritize your safety over everything else.
- Stay away from ditches, telephone poles, vending machines, etc., and be careful of falling objects.
- Do not move in random; confirm safety first.
- Understand the damage situation accurately.
- Move to the evacuation site that you and your family have decided in advance. However, to ensure your own safety, you may have to

- use a different evacuation site depending on where you are or the surrounding situation.
 - During evacuation, follow instructions from the police and fire department.
- Evacuate on foot and take minimum necessary baggage.
- (If handling fire, put out the fire only after ensuring your own safety.)
- Try to collect accurate information and move in groups whenever possible.
- Use the stairs, not the elevators.
- Try to help the injured or help extinguish small fires.
